#### Local Rules

- The Rules of Golf as adopted by the USGA together with the Rules of Etiquette as adopted by the USGA shall be the rules of the Club, except when in conflict with local rules or with any of the rules herein.
- Native Grass and Wooded Areas - Where not marked out of bounds, these areas shall be played as a lateral hazard. Drop within two club lengths of the point of entry, no closer to the hole. One stroke penalty.

#### Course Markings

- Penalty areas are defined by red stakes. If no stakes are present, the margin of the penalty area is defined by the water's edge or the edge of the mowed grass and shall be considered a penalty area.
- Red stakes with green caps define environmentally protected areas. These areas may not be entered by a player at any time. Environmentally protected areas are played as penalty areas, as defined by Rule 17, although the player has no option to play the ball from the penalty area. Where provided, player options also include utilizing ball drop areas on holes requiring forced carry.
- All course yardages will be to the center of the green.
- Golf course irrigates with non-potable water. Do not drink!

#### Playing Guidelines

- Play "Ready Golf" at all times. Keep up with the group in front of you.
- All players will check in with golf shop and starter prior to beginning play.
- Please repair all ball marks, fill divots with mix provided in carts and rake sand in bunkers.
- Golf carts are not permitted in the parking lot. Carts must remain on paths around all tees and greens. Please keep carts on path on all par three holes and where otherwise temporarily requested.
- Golfers are responsible for injury or damage caused by errant shots.
- It is strictly forbidden for an individual without a valid driver's license to operate the golf cart.
- Golfers agree to operate the golf cart in a safe and courteous manner at all times. Golfers agree to be responsible for any or all damages and replacement costs for the rented golfing equipment.

#### General Information

- Only food and beverage purchased on premises are permitted.
- If lightning is in the area, all play shall cease. Although the golf staff may warn players about lightning in the area of which we are aware, the Club does not assume any duty to detect lightning and warn players. If Club personnel warns players about potential lightning in the area, players must stop play immediately.

## North Course Story



The whelk is a top-down view of the Channel Whelk found in the Atlantic Ocean, specifically along the Connecticut Coast. The whelk is a large sea snail that was until recent times found in great abundance. Not only was the whelk a source of food for the Eastern Woodland people of the Atlantic Coast, but also the center of the long narrow neck of the shell was used to make shell beads. The cream-colored cylinder from the whelk was then paired with the deep purple beads of the Quahaug clam shell to create what is called wampum. Wampum has long been used by the Eastern Woodland and many other tribal nations through trade for its craftsmanship and its beauty, for decoration, jewelry and adornment and in the creation of wampum belts used in storytelling, gifts of great respect and making of treaties. Later uses that are more familiar with the term wampum being used as a form of currency which was introduced later during trading with the European fur traders. Today wampum is used closer to its original and artistic purposes for Native Peoples.

Our course logos were inspirations of the original artist Rebecca Perry Levy's appreciation for these animals, and to convey their importance in the daily lives of the Eastern Woodland people.
